- More resources

- Apprenticeships for business

Q: What would you suggest to reduce crime in Allendale County?

- More parental involvement
- Arrest bad guys; enforce current laws
- Adequate resources, such as to implement the Broken Window concept
- Convince jurors to convict criminals legally -- educate jurors
- Address chemical dependencies
- Parents/social workers in school
- Have the punishment fit the crime
- More mentoring and positive role models
- Transitional reentry programs for people getting out of prison
- Identify at-risk kids and provide mentoring programs
- Prison-reentry program
- Reduce dilapidated property
- Officers to be mentors

Q: What are some impediments or barriers to change in Allendale County?

- Money
- Communication (ineffective between county and entities in county)
- “Buddy system” -- the good ol’ boy system
- Lack of jobs and skilled workers
- Lack of term limits for officials
- Lack of working together
- Hidden agendas
- School system (people won’t come here because of reputation)
- Lack of community leadership (“If we don’t have it, we won’t grow)
- Proximity to Charleston or Savannah, making it too easy for someone to live or work somewhere else
- Lack of community involvement
- Lack of civic clubs
- Nothing to do for anyone who moves here; few restaurants or amenities
- Internet access
- Cell phone service
- Decreasing population
- Lack of public transportation
- Why aren’t we marketing?
- No easy entry into the marketplace
- Stop badmouthing ourselves
- Have had 12 school district superintendents over 14 years; no leadership continuity

Q: If you had only One Big Idea to make the county better, what would it be?

- Develop 100 acres for housing, retail business
- High school tech school
- Cultural/social shift in community (adult activities, after school programs, draw parents in; adult education)
- Infrastructure restoration, sewer, stormwater
- Internet access
- Regional farmers market
- Distribution of agricultural products to the country through railroad hub in Fairfax
- Grow more stuff for SC markets
- Long-term tax incentives for businesses and land
